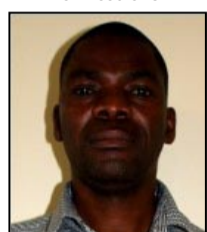

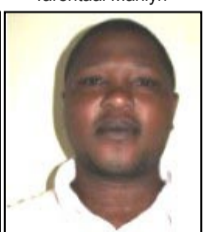

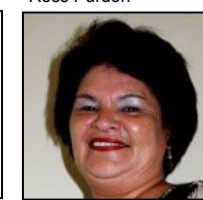

### From the Mayor

As part of our strategy and commitment to improve communication to the broader Ndlambe community once again we have improvised on our bi-monthly newsletter and made it user-friendly, attractive and informative.

Communication will forever remain in the centre of governance as it is a tool to communicate our government achievements and challenges to our people young and old in urban, semi-urban and to rural poor communities. I must say that the role of our civil society structures in shaping our communication strategy is also recognised. The municipality has been in the past criticised for the lack or poor communication to its residents, but we have since improvised by ensuring that both Public Participation Unit in the office of the Hon. Speaker and Customer Care Unit are established and now we introduce an improvised quarterly newsletter which deal with issues of governance and service delivery achievements. This newsletter will be in line with what is taking place at the level of our District and will be linked to the Provincial Government Communications Information Systems (GCIS). In this way there will be coherent and synergy between our municipality and government sector departments because local government must not operate in silos from the rest of public sector main stream. Ward committees on the other hand will forever remain a cornerstone of participatory democracy and engine for public participation in shaping our municipal Integrated Development Plan (IDP) and must begin to truly work side by side with our ward councillors to advance developmental needs of our poor communities. To demonstrate our commitment to our ward committees we have developed



a Policy that will regulate the functioning of ward committees and to make them effective. The Policy has since been sent to the Department of Local Government and Traditional Affairs for comments and once it pass that stage it will be published for public comments and finally be adopted by the ordinary council as required by law. The council took a decision to reimburse ward committee members for out of pocket expenses to the tune of R 700.00 per sitting to basically encourage effective participation and attendance of ward committee meetings by members.

As we will be engaged in IDP/Budget review process for 2014/2015 financial year, I wish to appeal to municipal management, councillors, Community Based Organisations, Youth formations, Sport Associations, People with Disability and Gender Organisations, Faith Based Organisations, Business, Sector Departments and organs of civil society to fully participate in this process. To this effect the municipal council has since adopted an Intergovernmental Relations Policy and also established Ndlambe Intergovernmental Forum where every sector is represented.

I trust that we will continue working together for the betterment of our communities and continue to listen to our people regardless of their colour, gender or creed. I therefore wish this municipal quarterly newsletter a success.

### From the Municipal Manager

#### WATER

The financial year has come and gone with its successes and challenges. The community now know that without adequate water there is no sufficient development that can change the lives of the people, which is why council has put water as the first priority. The department of Water Affairs has commissioned Amatola Water as an implementing agent in a R165 million project that is currently implemented in Alexandria and Port Alfred. The Thornhill housing project will commence in the near future as soon as some of the finance related matters have been sorted out, and water closure in Alexandria will be history.

Kenton on Sea will soon be building not less than 500 low cost houses, because there will now be adequate water to unlock that project. The revamping of the sewerage infrastructure in Ekuphumleni Township through the Municipal Infrastructural Grant (MIG) has enabled this housing project to be realised, however there is not enough water to build in Marcell. Completion of the water projects in the Eastern side of Ndlambe will see Bathurst getting good water quality as it will connect to Port Alfred's water pipelines, as well as improvement in sanitation.

This shows how the financial interventions from the Department of Water Affairs in conjunction with Amatola Water have assisted the municipality in delivering clean water to communities, let alone the potential investment and tourism that this will bring to the area. A huge number of jobs have been created during the implementation of these projects.

#### ROADS

The other priority in our IDP is the roads. Our roads are dilapidating at a fast rate because they don't have intensive maintenance that could prolong their lifespan. After the 2012 October floods many roads, especially in the CBD of Port Alfred have been paved. Its council's stance that to avoid maintenance costs block paving of roads is the route to go. This has created a lot of jobs with local businesses as well benefiting a lot in terms of the material bought from them.

We would like to thank the following during the catastrophic events of October 2012 for the role they played: Department of Local Government and Traditional Affairs, Public Works and Rural Development, CACADU District Municipality, Stenden University, Methodist Church, NGO's and other businesses and individuals who volunteered their time.

#### CLEAN AUDIT CAMPAIGN

We are determined more than ever to obtain an unqualified Auditors report for

2013/14 on our own without using consultants but through our own staff. We have attended to the matters that have qualified us in 2011/12 and have not created any new qualifying matters in 2012/13 as far as we are concerned, and we are embarking on 2014 clean audit campaign and we endeavour to be counted among those that will achieve that status. We would like to applaud CACADU District municipality and the Department of Local Government and Traditional Affairs to select Ndlambe Municipality among the four municipalities in the province to be assisted to get a better Auditors Report, let alone that no one has arrived as yet. One would appreciate if they can use those resources for 2013/14 rather as it is late for the 2011/12, because the annual financial statement has been submitted for auditing.

#### Beautification Projects

The face of our townships is starting to take a form of being a human settlement as a result of the beautification projects, in the form of beautifying the entrances of our townships and the parks that are established. We would like to commend the Department of Environmental Affairs for funding the business plans and this signals that other business plans stand a chance of being funded as well. We would also like to extend our gratitude to the Department of Tourism for the chalets and conference facilities they had funded in Cannon Rocks, as well as the Blue Flag beaches and the beach cleaning project this department has funded.

#### LIBRARY IN KWANONQUBELA TOWNSHIP ALEXANDRIA

We would like to also thank the Department of Sport, Recreation, Arts and Culture for their contribution of funding a library in Kwanonqubela Township- Alexandria, as this aid in the building of a learning nation. The employment of staff in the library is also commendable because by so doing it has enhanced fluidity of the municipality.

#### MULTI-PURPOSE CENTRE IN THORNHILL

The Premier of the province Honourable Noxolo Kiviet needs to be commended for funding of the multi-purpose centre which is going to be built very soon in Thornhill. We also urge other departments to come on board because without their involvement, the purpose of that centre will not be realised.

#### LASTLY

It will be un-ethical not to appreciate the community development interventions made by Stenden University in the area. Sometimes they even intervene in areas where it is the responsibility of the municipality to render those services.

## FINANCE DEPARTMENT

The 2009 – 2013 General valuation Roll currently used for levying of rates expired in June 2013; an application was made in terms of the Act No 6 of 2004 to extend validity to 30 June 2014. Following an approval of this application, an extension request for a new general valuation will need to be compiled for implementation in July 2014. The municipality will appoint a Valuer, tasked with conducting public meetings, with various groups of the public. On completion of the general valuation, the public are encouraged to follow due valuation processes such as (valuation notices, objections and appeals) to ensure fair valuation of their properties. Such procedures will be communicated through the notices as they unfold. The public will soon see data collectors visiting their properties where necessary, we appeal to the public to cooperate with data collectors, as the municipal valuers will do their best to ensure clear identification in order to limit security risks to property owners.

### SUPPLEMENTARY VALUATION

Objection processes for the 2009 – 2013 general evaluation – known as the 6th supplementary have been closed, with the Council resolving that flood damaged properties be included in a valuation roll and be valued by a professional Municipal Valuer as the municipality can only rate properties based on the Valuers certified valuation roll.

Although October 2012 flood damaged property owners have expressed high dissatisfaction, Rate Payers have lodged an appeal against the Municipality Valuers decision as they believe that an appeal court will provide an opportunity for both parties to present their facts to the valuation appeal board Chairperson to deliberate and take an informed ruling. The provisional appeal hearing date is 18 October 2013.

### PREPAID ELECTRICITY AND DISTRIBUTION

The public can now access electricity coupons at FNB, Standard Bank, Pick 'n pay, Spar as well as Municipal vendors in Thornhill (Port Alfred) and Wentzel Park (Alexandria) An Internet option is also available.

ESKOM have appointed the "Blue Label" company as vendors, however these vendors charge a levy and any purchase from them results in the consumer paying more for their electricity than if they purchase vouchers through the above municipal list. In such cases the Municipality is in no way accountable as they have no control over these vendors.

### INTRODUCTION OF FREE BASIC ALTERNATIVE ENERGY

Part of this department's services is providing free basic needs to all indigent residents within our municipality, we would like to extend our free basic from formal settlements with municipal infrastructure (water tanks) to informal settlements and indigent residences and private land. This shift will now be on Free Basic Alternative Energy (FBAE) focusing on energy for lighting and cooking where there is no electricity available.

In the interest of safety, the municipality has chosen gel stoves and gel fuel, this is not foreign to some Port Alfred residents as these energy sources were issued to flood damaged property owners in NEMATO during October 2012.

We are in the implementation phase of this decision; two notices have been advertised for the procurement of the stoves and gel, other notice for the procurement of services for distribution of the purchased stoves and gel. This distribution is to be done by SMME from the respective wards. A total of 1250 residents across the wards were registered in the initial phase.
